Financial Support

The Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) is an excellent resource for students looking to finance their education. The OSFA website—www.indiana.edu/~sfa—provides information and possible tools for covering the cost of higher education. In addition, the OSFA has financial aid counselors who provide personal assistance via email, telephone, or in person. Students interested in any possible federal financial assistance should first complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Oncourse/OneStart

These two programs are essential to IU Bloomington students. Oncourse is an online environment where you can check grades, upload papers, receive and post class messages, view assignments, and more. Student Technology Centers

Parking Operations/Campus Bus

In fact, the Campus Bus Service provides a direct shuttle from the White Lot at Memorial Stadium to the heart of campus.
